This church offers services to those who were homeless. As winter approached, he began asking, “Where are they going to go? He wrote down his thoughts and titled it, **“Isaac’s Christmas Wish” ...I’m, going to do my best to work at getting donations and make sure the poor people will at least have one night of warmth and some food this Christmas.”**

Isaac met with the people at the church near his home to find out what kinds of things would be most helpful for the homeless people who came there. Then he began asking for donations of money and supplies so he could assemble **“Blessing Bags”**. Each bag contained a collection of items such as hand warmers, bottled water, fruit snacks and granola bars. Small but useful things. Isaac turned to his school community for help. Donation boxes were put near the school office and the word was spread to school families.
