Holy Thursday: The Mass of the Lord's Supper

Holy Thursday marks the end of Lent and the beginning of the Holy Triduum, which also includes Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday. On Holy Thursday we celebrate Jesus' institution of the sacrament of holy Eucharist, when Christ makes new the Passover meal of the Jewish people.

This night is also special because we remember the poor through a special collection.

Jesus knew that this would be his last supper. So, at the Last Supper, he did something striking to prepare his disciples to teach others about Him. He washed their feet. During the time of Jesus, there were no sewers. The roads were dirt and stone, and animals and people alike would leave their refuse in the streets. The role of washing the feet was left to the lowest servants. Jesus taught the disciples that a leader must have humility. This is Jesus' call to us to be teacher-servants.

At the end of the Holy Thursday service, we strip the sanctuary space of all its cloths and

furniture. We leave in darkness. With the apostles, we are called to vigil with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. Stay. Keep watch. Pray.

Altar of Repose

After our Holy Thursday service there will be an Altar of Repose in the Chapel until 10:00 PM, and again on Good Friday between 11:00 AM - 5:00 PM, excluding during the noon Stations, and 3:00 PM Communion service. All are welcome to this vigil, and people are encouraged to sign-up for a time slot on the Sign-Up sheets in the back of Church. The Men's Club will be present to safely escort people to and from their vehicles, and the Rosary Society will be present to pray a rosary at 8:45 PM.
